Dear Commissioner King:

Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following in your jurisdiction.

Currently, 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, NE traffic is controlled by a STOP sign at its intersection with Fort Lincoln Drive. A recent traffic engineering study has concluded that traffic signal control is justified at the intersection of 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and Fort Lincoln Drive, NE to accommodate vehicular and pedestrian traffic generated by the nearby commercial development. Traffic signal control can provide for the safe and efficient movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic at this intersection. The proposed new traffic signal can be timed and operated to work in harmony with adjacent traffic signals in the area.

Therefore, in the interest of promoting the safe and efficient movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic through and in the vicinity of this intersection, an independent determination has been made by the DDOT/Transportation Services Administration to remove the existing STOP sign control operation on 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, NE at Fort Lincoln Drive, and to install and operate a traffic signal at the intersection of 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and Fort Lincoln Drive, NE.

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing, not later than thirty days (30) after the date of this notice, with the District Department of Transportation, Transportation Operations Administration, 55 M Street, SE Washington, D.C. 20003.
