Re: Moving camera from Second and G to Second and F Streets N.E.

Dear Officer Molotsky:

On February 18, 2014, at a duly noticed, regularly scheduled monthly meeting of ANC 6C, with a quorum of 5 out of 6 commissioners and the public present, the above-mentioned matter came before us.

As you know from a previous meeting with ANC 6C, we are concerned about the safety of our constituents as pedestrians encountering the heavy commuter traffic on Second Street at F Street N.E. At this intersection we have had numerous near-miss accidents endangering pedestrians trying to cross Second Street on their way to and from Union Station, a major transportation hub with trains, buses, metro, and taxis that these pedestrians use on a daily basis.

Because of our concern for pedestrian traffic, the commissioners voted unanimously, 5:0:0 to support this request to move the camera recently placed at Second and G Streets N.E. to Second and F Streets N.E. The camera should be mounted to capture northbound traffic, specifically vehicles that do not stop for pedestrians at Second and F Streets N.E.

ANC 6C will also request DDOT signage to alert vehicles that a speed camera is nearby.

Thank you for giving great weight to the recommendations of ANC 6C.
