Dear Chair,

This spring, DDOT would like to install shared lane symbols on Fort Totten Drive NE from Hamilton Street to Bates Road. Shared lane symbols (also known as sharrows) indicate that motorists and cyclists are to share the travel lane. *Parking and automobile lanes will not be affected.* This section of road is part of the city's interim Metropolitan Branch Trail system that connects Union Station to Silver Spring, MD. The street is too narrow for bicycle lanes or a shared use path, but shared lane markings will help reinforce this important bicycling connection.

There are several benefits of installing shared lane symbols:

- They clearly delineate the proper lane positioning for bicycles. This is the space outside of the space where motorists may open their car doors.
- They encourage bicyclists to ride on the right side of the road (wrong way riding is against the law and a common cause of bicycle crashes).
- They inform motorists to expect bicycles on the street, and encourage safe passing.

The City has shared lanes in place already, such as those on R Street, NE and 12th Street, NE (see attached photos). These have proved popular with motorists, residents and bicyclists.
