**Notice of Intent (NOI) #13-129-TOA**  
**Re: Installation of "Resident Only" Residential Permit Parking**


Pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000" D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to provide written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following modifications in your jurisdiction.

Currently, Residential Permit Parking (RPP), Zone 6, exists in the 800 block of 5<sup>th</sup> Street, N.E. between the hours of 7:00 AM to 8:30 PM, Monday through Friday. DDOT received a valid petition from the residents of this block to have the current RPP be converted to RPP, Zone 6, between the hours of 7:00 AM to Midnight, Monday through Sunday.

DDOT conducted a traffic and parking survey which revealed no impact to the overall circulation or safety of pedestrians, bicyclist, or motorists. Therefore, DDOT has made an independent decision to convert the existing RPP in the 800 block of 5<sup>th</sup> Street, N.E. Resident Only, Zone 6 parking signs will be installed on the west side of the 800 block of 5<sup>th</sup> Street, N.E., from 7:00 AM to Midnight, Monday through Sunday. Additionally, two (2) hour Resident Only, Zone 6 parking signs will be installed along the east side of the block.

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing, no later than thirty (30) days after the date of this notice, with the District Department of Transportation (DDOT), Transportation Operations Administration (TOA), 55 M Street, SE, Washington, D.C. 20003.
