Re: Notification of Approval for Reserved Residential Parking Space for Disabled Resident


Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give a written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following modifications in your jurisdiction.

The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) received an Application for Reserved Residential Parking Space for Disabled Resident from Ms. Karen Teresa McNeill at 1007 I Street, N.E. According to 54 DCR 903 (February 2, 2007), section 2710.1 through 2710.3, the Director of DDOT may reserve one (1) on-street parking space for any District resident who applies in writing for a reserved space and who qualifies under section 2710.1 (a) through (e).

DDOT conducted a parking survey which revealed no impact to the overall circulation or safety of pedestrians, bicyclists, or motorist. Therefore, DDOT has made an independent decision to allow Ms. McNeill to have a reserved on-street parking space with the shortest possible circulation route.

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing, not later than thirty days (30) after the date of this notice, with the District Department of Transportation, Transportation Operations Administration, 55 M Street, N.W.
